2011 Theme Announced



After taking the stage to the tune of "California, Here I Come," RI President-elect Ray Klinginsmith announced the 2010-11 RI theme, Building Communities -- Bridging Continents, during the opening plenary session of the 2010 International Assembly. Klinginsmith said he arrived at the theme after reviewing RI themes of years past. He noticed that only a few spoke to non-Rotarians.

"As a result, I decided to search for a briefly stated theme that would fulfill two objectives: the first to explain Rotary to non-Rotarians, and the second to validate our work for Rotarians," he said. "The words I have selected to describe Rotary's current mission and to highlight our achievements are what we do best: Building Communities -- Bridging Continents."

The president-elect described how his 50 years of Rotary experience have contributed to his focus on communities at home and abroad. For example, as a Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholar, he studied for a year in South Africa, becoming the first student from his small town of Unionville, Missouri, USA, to study abroad.

The theme announcement is a reflection of Klinginsmith's willingness to embrace change. He encouraged district governors-elect to reexamine traditional procedures that were no longer best practices and to begin new traditions where appropriate.

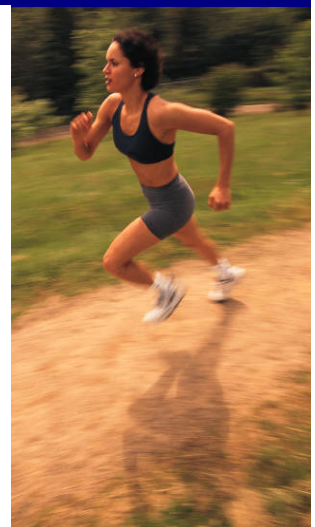

Future Vision Rotary Grant

Recently, the Santee-Lakeside Rotary Board of Directors unanimously voted to support a Future Vision Rotary Grant to bring water to nine villages in Kenya and to serve as the primary international partner club for this project. The board authorized a contribution of \$2,000 to go towards the \$200,000 project. A condition for participating in this project is that at least two, and hopefully more, members of the Club attend the Rotary District Grants Management Seminar in San Diego on Saturday, March 20, 2010. The seminar will be part of the District Assembly occurring that same date. The Club will also need to establish a project committee comprised of at least three member Rotarians. It would be helpful for anyone interested in helping on this committee to attend the seminar. Please give it some serious consideration. For new members: this is a good opportunity for you to get your feet wet in terms of supporting Rotary's International projects.

During the February 11, 2010 Club meeting, Bill Stumbaugh provided an overview of his visit to Kenya last fall with fellow Rotarians. The trip allowed them the opportunity to assess the feasibility of a water project in the Maasai tribal area south of Nairobi. They have been working on this project proposal and garnering support from various Rotary groups since their visit. They now have commitments for almost all the funds needed to generate enough of a Rotary International match to reach the \$200,000 project budget. This includes \$65,000 from three Rotary Districts in Japan and other funds from the La Jolla Golden Triangle Rotary Club and now our Club. It is noteworthy to share that Past District Governor, Steve Brown, is playing a significant leadership role in developing this project.

RYLA 2010 will be held from Friday, April 16th to Sunday, April 18th, 2010.
